*Until the Whole World Knows!* It is hard to believe that we are in the month of October and fastly approaching November. To update you on what’s been happening at Trinity since our last newsletter -- we celebrated our 6th anniversary on October 1. God provided a leader six years ago to reach out to the community of Woodbridge, Virginia. He provided him with a worship place and called it Trinity Baptist Church. God provided a few Believers that have grown to over 90 members. God provided land and a seemingly impossible way for us to be able to afford and purchase for a permanent worship place. God has blessed Trinity Baptist with people that love Him and His work. They sacrifice to give, to serve and to witness for the Lord Jesus. Most importantly, we are a church that knows that the great commission is to share the gospel with the world and God has provided us with you - our missionary families. *To God be the Glory for the great things He has done!*

Leading up to anniversary Sunday, Pastor Arrindell had requested that the church pray for an attendance of 250 this year, 50 more than last year. God filled the sanctuary with 288. The ushers could not move fast enough to add more chairs. From the Sunday School worship, choir ministering through songs and the Pastor delivering an dynamic sermon on “Finding Help In Time of Need” *Hebrews 4:16* (the Invitation, Assurance, Confidence and Access to the Throne of Grace by Mercy in our time of need). Members commented later the joy they felt in imaging what it must be like “when we all actually do get to heaven.” Those of you who have worshiped with us, know we also like the physical feast. The lunch served put a splendid end to blessed filled day.

On October 15, we welcomed Missionary David Paskal of Jewish descendant and from New York City into the Trinity missionary family. His testimony and sharing of the Burning Bush Baptist Ministries works in the Jewish community and others communities of New York was another great opportunity for Trinity to be able to expand our knowledge, the need and the interest or curiosity of the Jewish community to learn about Jesus Christ. **Praise Report**

*Missionary Tom & Marguerite Gentry* (September 2006) share the wonderful way that the Lord has blessed the camps this year along with the added financial burdens. "Camp Hope for the Future 2006" saw 517 souls make a profession of faith in Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior, 51% of the campers this year were already saved, from previous years of camp. (Success is killing us number wise.) Added to that is the fact that 72% of the unsaved that came to camp this year trusted Christ and that out of almost 1500 campers only 177 departed unsaved. After 14th years this still seems to be incredible to me. If we add to this the young people that were saved in the weeks of camp that Keith and I preached in Moldova this year the total comes out to about 1000 trusting Christ. God is so good! Upcoming blessing include a sending service for Georgi & Dana Serban, former students, who will be going into one of the most difficult areas of Romania to preach the Gospel; a sending service for Emi & Lore Marianciuc, our graduates, who will by the grace of God be departing for Malawi in October. And finally, the dedication of the church building in Satu Mare. You will not believe what God has done. (October 2006) At this moment I am rejoicing with you while sitting in the home of Magada a dear Malawian friend. When we arrived in Malawi we found that all was in order. It was a special time of rejoicing as we have added a new family of Romanian missionaries to the team. Thank you so much for all of you that have prayed and helped to make this possible. The reason for this letter is to share with

you the miraculous way that the Lord has worked through you our faithful supporters to get the ministry back on track financially. The interesting thing was that the biggest part of the financial help that we received came through individuals. While I will be sending out letters of thanks to all who gave I want you to know that **this was a team effort and that the LORD our God has heard and answered your prayers.** What this means is that all camp debts have been paid and that Hope for the Future School of Missions is still up and running. Currently, we have 23 students in the school. Because of a change in the law, 4 of our students were not able to return to Romania from the Republic of Moldova after summer break. If all goes well they will be returning in January. **Please be in prayer that we will be able to get extended visas for these students.** Former graduates Emi and Lore are now in Malawi and Georgi and Dana have gone to southern Romania to work with a church planting team there. Please continue to pray for Ramona as she waits on the Lord to open a door into a Moslem country.

At this time our greatest need is to purchase wood to be processed and ready to start building cabins this spring. The Lord has brought an American missionary to our aid that has equipment and the know-how to see this project through from start to finish. What we need to do in the coming months is to raise about \$11,200. This will enable us to buy and process all the wood that we will need to build four cabins that will house 45 each and help us with our target of housing 500 campers/week. Please be in prayer as we move forward to raise funds for the purchase of wood for the cabins. Our goal is to purchase all of the wood by December so that it could be dry and ready for use in the spring. We praise God for you. Thank you for allowing me to serve you by serving our Lord. Pray that He will be glorified in all that we do.

*Missionary Tim & Linda Woodring* (October 2006) Greetings in the wonderful name of our Lord Jesus Christ. Thanks for allowing us to share about our work here in Mexico. Just last week they carried the virgin through the streets of Zapopan here in Guadalajara. It was a big holiday here. They partied all night with dancing and drinking in the streets. In the morning over 3 million people gathered as they carried the statue of Mary through the streets. It is so sad to see the idolatry and the devotion of people to a religion that gives them no hope. We have a new area Bible school started among Huichol and Cora people in the village of Presidio de los Reyes. We will be going there one weekend every month to teach class all day long. This is about a six-hour drive from Guadalajara. Once a month we have CESI (area Bible school) all day in the village of Tequila. The church in Tequila is growing. It has been very difficult trying to plant a church there but things are really beginning to look up. Praise the Lord. Tequila is a little over an hour drive from here.

Last week we took a group of around 40 kids out to have Bible clubs in different areas of Guadalajara. These kids have been going through Evangelism Explosion for Kids. It was very exciting seeing kids sharing with other kids about Jesus Christ. The first of November we will be going to Colotlan for the weekend. We will be going out to a ranch where there are about 5 different homes with large families, some have over 10 kids. One of the married daughters that no longer live there is a Christian and has introduced us to her family. We are invited back to share a Christian film which gives the plan of salvation. So pray for this opportunity that the Lord will open the hearts of the ranching community that they may respond to the Gospel of Jesus Christ. We will be with the church in Colotlan on Sunday morning and in the afternoon will be sharing in the jail. Thanks so much for standing with us and your interest in the work here in Mexico. God bless as you live for Him.
